## FlexWiki Pre-Requisites

Please ensure you take the following steps before continuing with the FlexWiki integration.

1.) You will need to have ASP.NET version 1 (at least) enabled on the domain you wish to install FlexWiki.

To do this, go to the domain in Helm that you want to install FlexWiki on, and click "Web Site Settings". You will be taken to this page:

2.) Ensure that either ASP.Net Version 1 or Version 2 is selected (as highlighted) and click Save to complete this pre-requisite.

# FlexWiki Application Pack Installation

To install FlexWiki:

1.) Download the FlexWiki Application Pack from here:

<http://download.webhostautomation.net/Helm/downloads/addons/FlexWiki%20Support%201.0.1.exe>

2.) Double click the Application Pack file, and the FlexWiki Application Pack will be installed.

## FlexWiki Application Pack Configuration

Once you have installed the application pack for FlexWiki, you now need to configure FlexWiki in your plans and packages so it is available to your end users.

Assuming you've already got a Web Resource set up, go into your existing Reseller Plans and Hosting Plans and set the number of FlexWiki installations to be the number that you wish to offer. For example:

# Installing FlexWiki on a Domain

1.) In Helm, go to the domain that you want to install FlexWiki on and click "Application Packs" from the Domain Menu:





2.) On the next screen, you'll see FlexWiki in the list of available Application Packs:

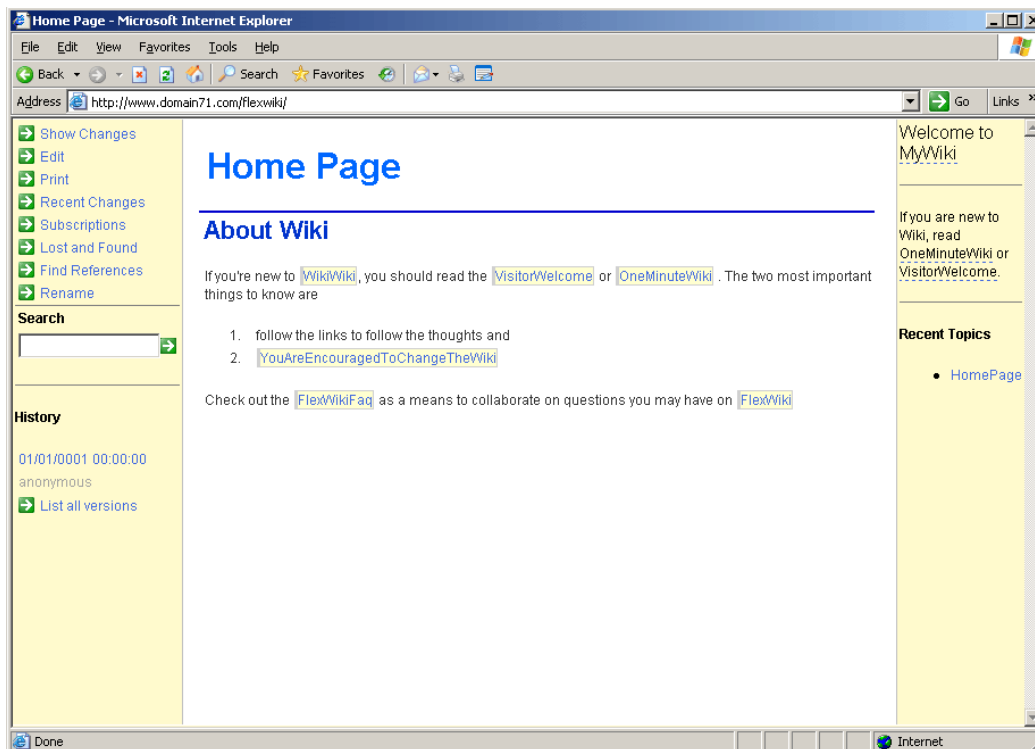
